

Captain Anthony John (Tony) Moore **08/02/1960 - 04/10/2019**

WO1 AJ 'Tony' Moore, RSM of the 5th/6th Battalion the Royal Victoria Regiment 1995-1997 died on 4th of OCT 19 aged 59. After serving as the RSM of 5/6 RVR, Tony left the ARA and worked in a variety of jobs before finding a significant role in Protective Services Victoria. His funeral was held in Hurstbridge and was well attended by friends, family and colleagues from 1 RAR, 2/4 RAR, School of Infantry as well as the current RSM-A WO-A Grant McFarlane. Some familiar ex-5/6 RVR Training WO's in Kim Challends and Jim Smith were also there for the occasion. Several current and ex-members of the unit also attended the funeral reflecting well on the man he was and his influence on us.



It was said at the funeral that Tony was about mentoring people effectively within the Army before Army knew what mentoring was, which accurately described his impact on those of us fortunate enough to be at 5/6 RVR when he was our RSM. Post his ARA service, Tony was a member of the GRES and as a CAPT, served again with 5/6 RVR and deployed to the Solomon Islands to support RAMSI.

Tony is survived by his wife Sara and two sons Ricky (ex 5/6 RVR) and Steve (1 RAR). Tony was a good bloke, a professional soldier, well-respected gone far too early. Vale.
